
The Butler County Criminal Justice Advisory Board and Butler County Human Services Present:

Pete Earley

Mental health advocate, author and journalist, Pete Earley is best-known for his nonfiction book, *CRAZY: A Father's Search Through America's Mental Health Madness*, which was one of two finalists for the 2007 Pulitzer Prize. (*The word CRAZY in the title refers to our current mental health system, which Earley shows in his book to be deeply flawed*.)

Kevin Early is a successful certified peer to peer mental health worker who previously worked on a jail diversion team in Fairfax Virginia.
